

## Catch Up Premium Report 2016



The year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium is additional funding given to schools to support year 7 students who did not achieve at least level 4 (now 'expected standard') in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2. The actual catch up funding figure is yet to be confirmed for 2017-18, but is assumed to be in line with previous years.

In 2016, we used the catch up funding in the following ways

Literacy intervention	Reading intervention every form time 1:1 Literacy intervention with Head of English Whole school Literacy focus	Reading skills improved over time – see analysis
Numeracy intervention	Numeracy form time programme 1:1 intervention from Head of Maths Whole school Numeracy focus	Numeracy skills improved and access to the curriculum resulted in all years ending 2016 within a 10% pp – Non gap
IDL programme	LSA intervention with specific Literacy IDL programme delivered daily	Reading skills improved over time so students were reaching their chronological reading age
LSA support 2 hours a week 1:1	LSA in class support for those identified as being below expected on entry	Improved numeracy and literacy skills of those who didn't meet the expected level
Resources for pupils with low literacy levels	Coloured overlays, low challenge high interest books etc	Improved literacy skills
Staff training	IDL training for LSAs NQT/SEND training	Staff are better equipped to cater for the varying needs in their classroom
